

TWO OF LA'S LEADING THEATRES TEAM UP IN EARLY 2011 ROGUE MACHINE & FIREFLY WILL PRODUCE LA PREMIERE OF "DIRT," BY BRUCE GOOCH

Dirt, which will mark the first collaboration for Rogue Machine and Firefly, is a gritty, poetic play set for its Los Angeles premiere at Theatre/Theater. Performances begin Wednesday, January 26 for a limited engagement through Sunday, February 27. Opening is set for Friday, January 28 at 8pm.

When an estranged son returns home and finds his father fighting to hold onto his mind, they are thrust into a struggle to control their land and the memories it holds. *Dirt* explores how we forge our identities through our connections to our home, to our past, and to each other. The play made its world premiere at the Williamstown Theatre Festival directed by Jenny Sullivan and starring the late James Whitmore and **John Dennis Johnston**, who will star in the Los Angeles premiere, which will be directed by **Bruce Gooch** and will also star **Ryan Johnston** and **Andrea Robinson**.

Playwright and director **Bruce Gooch** is making his Los Angeles stage debut with this production. His most recent work includes writing a feature adaptation of Lew Wallace's *Ben Hur; a Tale of the Christ* for Academy Awardwinner Albert Ruddy and Clearview Pictures, where Bruce also has his screenplay *Whiskey Kisses. Dirt* star **John Dennis Johnston** grew up in Nebraska and begin his career in Omaha dinner theatres doing musicals. He went on to work in New York and Chicago before landing in LA and more than 100 television shows and films over 35 years, from *Annie Hall*, to *Roots*, to *Close Encounters of the Third Kind*, and more. **Ryan Johnston** was last seen on a Los Angeles stage playing Ben in the LA premiere of *The Four of Us*, for which he received a Maddy Award and a Ticketholder nomination, and is best known as Patrick McCreary from *Grand Theft Auto IV*. **Andrea Robinson** has been twice nominated for a Canadian Emmy for her series regular role on the series *Doc* and, in addition to numerous guest star roles, has also been seen in the films *The Nutty Professor II: the Klumps* and in *Sgt. Bilko* with Steve Martin. The show will be produced by **Johnny Clark**, **Natalia Duncan**, and **Steven Klein**. The design team for *Dirt* includes **David Potts** (set), **John McElveney** (props), **Derrick McDaniel** (lights), **Gelareh Khalioun** and **Karina Torrico** (costumes), and **Kyle Johnston** and **Matthew McGaughey** (original music and sound). The assistant stage manager is **Brenda Goldstein**, and the production stage manager is **Amanda Mauer**.

Dirt will be presented at Theatre/Theater, at 5041 W. Pico Blvd (just west of La Brea) in Los Angeles. Preview performances are Wednesday, January 25 at 8:00pm and Thursday, January 26 at 8:00pm. Opening night is set for Friday, January 27 at 8:00pm. Performances run through February 27, Thursday through Saturday at 8:00pm with Sunday matinees at 3:00pm. Preview tickets are \$15 and regular seats are \$25. Tickets are available via phone at (323) 960-5563 and online at www.roguemachinetheatre.com.

Bruce Gooch (Writer/Director) | Bruce has worked in the theatre and the film and television industry in North America and Scandinavia for over thirty years as an actor, writer, director and coach. He is privileged to be able to work with these immensely talented actors and designers and this exceptional company. He is humbled by their belief and dedication in this play.

John Dennis Johnston (*Papa*) | John Dennis Johnston grew up in Nebraska and began his career in Omaha area dinner theatres doing musicals. He worked in New York and Chicago and before landing in LA and starting to work doing over a hundred or so television shows and Movies the last 35 years. He met Bruce Gooch at the Old Globe in San Diego where they worked on an early version of *DIRT*. Johnston says "I love working with the author and this play is very special to me. Ryan Johnston (*Zac*) | Ryan Johnston began his work in acting, directing, and producing while studying theatre and vocal music at the University of Nebraska and has been collaborating with Firefly since 1998. LA

Amanda Mauer (Production Stage Manager) | Amanda Mauer is a playwright, stage manager, and Rogue Machine's Production Manager. Her plays have recently appeared at Third Eye Theatre's Grand Guignol 2 (Portland, OR), Moveable Piece's Greenscape (Hollywood), Screaming Media's Gi60 (Halifax, Rogue Machine has produced her work as part of Shorts & Sweets and the Around the-Clock Play Festival. She's stage managed a bunch of productions around LA and looks forward to the next bunch. Thanks to David, always.

Brenda Goldstein (Assistant Stage Manager) | Brenda is a Los Angeles native who graduated from CSUN with a BA in Theatre Arts. She is excited to be working once again with Firefly. Some of the shows Brenda has worked on include the LA premiere of The Four of Us at the Elephant Lab Theatre, the world premieres of *Pin-Up* Girls and Tracing Sonny at the Avery Schreiber Theatre, Rupture at the Unknown and the West Coast premiere of The Jazz Age at the 2nd Stage Theatre. 
